



STRESSED SOUNDS: CAREFUL with Homographs!

- to contest vs. a <u>co</u>ntest to present vs. a present to perfect vs. perfect
- to re<u>cord</u> vs. a <u>re</u>cord
- TENDENCY: 2-syllable verbs carry stress on last syllable; nouns and adjectives carry stress on first syllable.





CHANGED SOUNDS: CAREFUL with Homographs! to alternate (8) vs. an alternate (it) to estimate (8) vs an estimate (it) to moder<u>ate</u> (8) vs moderate (it) to separate (8) vs separate (it)

TENDENCY: verbs that end in 'ate' are pronounced as such. Nouns and adjectives change the sound to 'it'.






