What is Reported Speech?

You said, "I want more." = DIRECT speech.

Dijiste, "Quiero mas."

You said that you wanted more. = REPORTED speech.

Dijiste que querías mas.

I told you to jump in!

¡Te dije que te metieras!**

= REPORTED speech.



PRESENT She said (that) you need to talk to the boss today.

PAST She said (that) you needed to talk to the boss yesterday.

FUTURE She said (that) you would need to talk to the boss.

Ella dijo que necesitarías hablar con la jefa.

QUESTIONS She asked if you needed to talk to the boss.

Ella preguntó si necesitabas hablar con la jefa.

ORDERS* The boss said to stay after the meeting to talk to her.

La jefa dijo que se quedara* después de la reunión para hablar con ella.





FORM & USE Reported Speech - PAST

When the relevance is in the PAST

DIRECT: I like your potato omelette.

REPORTED: She said **she liked** your potato omelette.

(the specific one you made)

DIRECT: Not all employees know.

REPORTED: He said not all employees knew.

(They didn't then; now they do)

REPORTED: She said **she finished watching** Modern Family.

PAST

She said she could well. (stays same)

They told them they had to do it.

You said you had to study more.

She said she might be able to go."

He said it might rain tomorrow. (stays same)

They said I should invest more. (stays same)
