What is the Present Perfect?







FORM Present Perfect

Things I've done

subject + have/has (auxiliary) + past participle (main verb)

I've been to Indonesia.

You've been to Indonesia.

We've been to Indonesia.

They've been to Indonesia.

He's been to Indonesia.

She's been to Indonesia.

It's been to Indonesia.

(3rd person singular: 's')







FORM Present Perfect

subject + have/has (auxiliary) + past participle (main verb)

REGULAR participles

I've rested a lot this week.

You've explained it well.

We've called them several times.

They've finished the report already.

He's always depended on it.

She's needed it recently.

It's worked until now.





FORM Present Perfect

subject + have/has (auxiliary) + past participle (main verb)

IRREGULAR participles

I've come early a lot this week.

You've taken it well.

We've written them several times.

They've done the report already.

He's always known it.

She's chosen it recently.

It's run well until now.



Present Perfect

3) Continuing Situations: things that started in the past and continue in the present (especially with the verb 'to be')

He has been my friend for years. = El es mi amigo desde hace años.

You've been really helpful today. = Has sido de gran ayuda hoy.

They've been married since June. = Llevan casados desde junio.

Sub + have/has + past participle

have worked you have worked we have worked they have worked

he/she/it has worked

Sub + have/has + been + verb+ing


I have been working you have been deciding we have been deciding they have been deciding

he/she/it has been working






TIME FRAME Present Perfect Continuous







TIME FRAME Present Perfect Continuous



I have been speaking for a long time!





Present Perfect Continuous

Says 'how long':

We've been watching the series for only a month.





Present Perfect Continuous

Focuses on the activity:

I've really been enjoying this series.





Present Perfect Continuous

Describes a new activity or an activity which may continue:

I've been working on the end of the month numbers.

She's been acting strange lately.

He's been driving me crazy!





Present Perfect Continuous

Used when we see evidence of recent activity:

You're sweating. Have you been exercising?





Present Perfect Continuous

We use 'for', 'since' and 'how long' to indicate time frame.

How long have you been volunteering?

I've been volunteering for 6 months.

I've been volunteering since January.





Present Perfect Continuous

Stative verbs are used to express 'states' or conditions like:

THOUGHTS & OPINIONS: agree believe, doubt, guess, know, mean, recognize, imagine, suspect, think, understand

FEELINGS & EMOTIONS: dislike, hate, like, love, prefer, want, wish

SENSES & PERCEPTIONS: appear, be, feel, hear, look, see, seem, smell, taste

POSSESSION & MEASUREMENT: belong, have, measure, own, possess





USE vs

Present Perfect

Present Perfect Continuous

With PURE stative verbs we NEVER use the continuous form; we use the Present Perfect:

I've known her for about 10 years.

We've belonged to that association since last year.

Deception has always existed.

They've owned that property since I met them.

They've had* that car for only a couple of years.

He's been* here all week.





Present Perfect

Present Perfect Continuous

Some stative verbs use both Present Perfect & Present Perfe

I've lived in Madrid for 18 years.

She's worked there for a year.

He's had a lot of problems lately.

I've drunk only one coffee today.

& Present Perfect Continous:

I've been living in Madrid for 18 years.

She's been working there for a year.

He's been having a lot of problems lately.

I've been drinking more coffee than usual.



CONFUSION!!









REMEMBER!

Some verbs are USUALLY used in simple NOT continuous form:

state: be, cost, fit, mean

possession: belong, have, own

brain work: believe, know, think, understand

We've been here for a while.

NOT: We've been being here for a while.

He has owned it for 10 years.

NOT: He has been owning it for 10 years.

She has always known it.

NOT: She has always been knowing it.





REMEMBER!!

Incorrect use of Present Perfect Continuous:

Improper use of PPC:

CORRECT tense:

I've been living in London. (Ya no vivo allí.) I lived in London

I've been travelling around the U.S. (Ya no estoy viajando.)

I have travelled to the U.S.

I've been being here early every day.

(No se usa 'be' asi)

I have been here early every day





COMMON CONFUSION!!

Present Simple vs Prese

Present Continuous

I <u>work</u> for the Castilla y Leon government.

= My job is permanent

I'm working for the Castilla y Leon government.

= My job is temporary

I <u>live</u> in Valladolid.

= My residence is permanent

<u>I'm living</u> in Valladolid.

= My residence is temporary
